ANSWER (3) THREE QUESTIONS. THE QUESTIONS CARRY EQUAL MARKS.

- 1. Explain the rationale for filtering the Internet and evaluate the options available to libraries and organizations in the Caribbean for filtering access to information via the Internet.
- 2. Discuss the objectives of e-government portals / gateway websites and assess with examples their applicability and value to the "average Caribbean citizen".
- 3. State the roles of institutional repositories and the stage of their development in Caribbean universities. You should give examples from repositories / databases with which you are familiar.

- 4. Identify and discuss criteria which you would use for evaluating the accessibility of the content of electronic journals. Give examples from databases of e-journals provided by Caribbean libraries.
- 5. How have Caribbean governments advanced in the implementation of the Access to Information / Freedom of Information legislation? Comment on the current and potential roles of libraries and librarians in the implementation.
- 6. Assess with examples, the factors influencing access to information by visually impaired and blind people and identify the implications for new roles for libraries and librarians.
