Candidates are reminded that the examiners shall take into account the proper use of the English Language in determining the mark for each response.

1. Describe the functions of the catalogue as set out by **BOTH** Cutter and FRBR (Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records) pointing out the similarities and differences between them. Explain how the eight elements for description found in AACR2 relate to these functions.
2. Explain the concepts of authorship in AACR2 and of main and added entries. Discuss the conditions for choosing main and added entries.
3. Give a brief description of the MARC Bibliographic Record Format and the Dublin Core Metadata Element Set. For each of the above, give **FOUR (4)** reasons for its use.
4. Define Internet resources then propose **FOUR (4)** reasons for cataloguing them and **THREE (3)** related challenges.
5. Describe the Connexion cataloguing service and the underlying WorldCat database offered by OCLC. Give **THREE (3)** points recommending its use and **TWO (2)** points cautioning against its use by a library that is considering using that service. Indicate the type of library.
6. Write brief notes on **ALL** of the following. All carry equal marks.
  - Serials cataloguing
  - Authority control and work
  - Development of cataloguing codes
  - Cataloguing In Publication (CIP)
