The UWI World War II Story: The Gibraltar Camp Experience

Tour the grounds of The University of the West Indies, Mona Campus that housed the site of the Gibraltar Camp, built in the 1930's for evacuees from the British island fortress of Gibraltar at the tip of Spain and, eventually, to Jewish refugees marooned in Spain and Portugal. There was even a civilian internment camp on the site in 1943.

View structures built in that period, nestled among the monuments and relics of the sugar estates, some of which were converted to functional building space still in use on the campus.
