COURSE OUTLINE:

This Project Management course provides an introduction to the principles and practices of Project Management. The course is designed to equip participants with the required tools to manage projects allowing their organizations to make the quantum leap.

Materials in the course are based on the Project Management Institute, A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge (PMBOK® Guide) – Sixth Edition, Project Management Institute, Inc., 2017.

Each participant receives a copy as part of the course material.

OBJECTIVES:

At the end of this course, participants will be equipped to:

- o Initiate, plan, execute, monitor and control, and close a project;
- Define a project using a Project Charter;
- Identify and manage stakeholders through a Stakeholder Register and Stakeholder Engagement Plan;
- Develop a Project Management Plan to guide the execution, monitoring and controlling, and closing of a project;
- Use various Project Management tools and techniques; and
- Use Microsoft Project to develop a project schedule.
